Aloha & Happy Holidays,

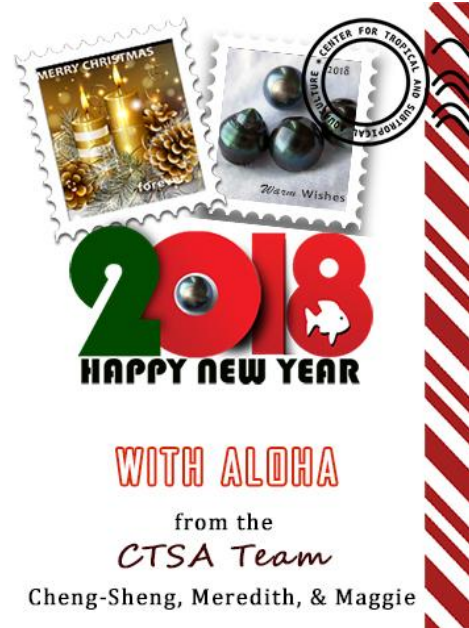

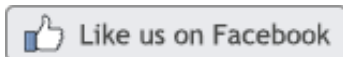


## AquaClip: Researchers find a way to breed Yellow Tangs
